The main hearing is expected to close in the coming weeks. Since last year reporting to UNESCO, preparatory proceedings for this case were terminated and on 21 October 2019 the Prosecutor has filed criminal charges against four persons before the Specialized Criminal Court in Pezinok on suspicion of criminal offenses, including ordering, aiding and committing of a premeditated assassination of late Ján Kuciak. During the main court proceedings, one of the indicted persons has admitted to committing the criminal offences and therefore this person was found guilty and on 6 April 2020 the court imposed an unconditional sentence of imprisonment for 23 years (the court decision is not valid yet). For the sake of completeness, it should be noted that this person is the direct executor of the killing / murder of Ján Kuciak. Criminal proceedings — the main hearing in relation to the other three persons is still in progress. To date (21.5.2020), a total of 15 hearings took place and the main hearing is expected to close in the coming weeks.

In July 2018, Ministry of Culture of the Slovak Republic established a Temporary Working Group aimed at legal protection of journalists. Two meetings were held so far.	Government officials, security and police forces, civil society and media actors	First meeting agreed a working plan. Definition of a journalist for legal purposes was drafted. Second meeting was devoted to the review of the amendment of the Press Act that will be the subject of further discussions by the Temporary Working Group. The activity of the temporary working group has been postponed since the beginning of the parallel negotiations at the National Council regarding another amendment to the Press Act which was adopted in September 2019. However, given the fact that the Ministry of Culture places great emphasis on respect for media freedom and independence, protection of journalists is still a topical and not less intensively discussed issue, thus Ministry of Culture plans to continue focusing on this topic. Furthermore, the new government elected in February 2020 determined the improvement of the position of journalists as one of the priorities in its government policy statement. With a view to the transposition of the revised Audiovisual Media Services Directive to the Slovak legislation, during the upcoming legislation process there will be opportunity for further improvement of the position of journalists and other media workers to ensure their protection and effective investigation and prosecution of crimes against them.

Since 2019 the Slovak Republic has been a member of the Media Freedom Coalition.	In this partnership it supports the freedom of speech and the security and guarantee of the media's ability to do its work in a safe environment. On 30 April 2020 the Slovak Republic joined the Declaration of the Media Freedom Coalition that was published on the occasion of the World Press Freedom Day.
