

## Background

Zimbabwe is exposed to multiple weather-related hazards, suffering from frequent periodic cyclones, droughts, floods, and related epidemics and landslides. As part of the Zimbabwe Idai Recovery Project (ZIRP), UNESCO will be implementing the project 'Comprehensive Resilience Building in the Chimanimani and Chipinge Districts'. The overall objective of the project is the reduction of the vulnerability of communities in the Chimanimani and Chipinge Districts to natural disasters, such as floods, droughts and landslides. The project also seeks to enhance water resource management as well as ecosystem services in response to the uncertainty of future climate change.

The project is part of the World Bank-funded Zimbabwe Idai Recovery Project (ZIRP), and in support of the UNOPS Community Infrastructure Project of the ZIRP.
