- targets primarily teaching staff (course teachers, instructors, trainers, lecturers, facilitators, etc)
- can be adopted to various training needs (initial training, upskilling, higher education)

Thematic Modules


(instruction + individual study)






CG total trainee workload: 600 hours

Curriculum globALE – The Content (Core Modules)

Module	Main Content	Workload
M1: The basis of adult learning and education (ALE)	 Understanding adult education in a national and global context, its main features and elements. 	30 instruction hours (≈ 5 days) + 24 hours of individual study
M2: Adult learning and adult teaching	 Learning theories and their use in ALE; 	30 instruction hours (≈ 5 days) +
	 motivation and barriers in ALE; 	24 hours of individual study
	the role of a trainer.	
M3: Communication and group dynamics in ALE	 Principles, approaches and techniques of 	24 instruction hours (≈ 4 days) +
	communication in ALE and of	20 hours of individual study
	 group dynamics of facilitating the learning process. 	
M4: Methods of ALE	 Understanding and applying appropriate ALE 	24 instruction hours (≈ 4 days) +
	methods for the goal, topic, group and context.	20 hours of individual study
M5: Planning, organization and evaluation of ALE	Phases of the training cycle (needs	24 instruction hours (≈ 4 days) +
	assessment, curriculum development, planning and organization, evaluation).	20 hours of individual study









Elective Modules

Elective Modules

Content: optional topics (depending on local needs)

Total volume: 166 hours (≈ 30% of total CG volume)

instructional hours: 48 individual study: 42 practical application: 76

Number: between 1-3 modules
