





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Title: The Rose Garden

Description

The Persian poet and scholar Muslih ud-Dīn Sadī Shīrāzī (circa 1213-1292) is known primarily as the author of Gulistan (The rose garden), one of the great masterpieces of Persian literature, which he completed in 1259. The work has a didactic and ethical character, and is still widely read, in the original Persian and in translations in many languages. This manuscript copy is written in the ta'liq script in two different hands, and contains numerous explanations and remarks in the margins and in the text. The manuscript is dated 1585 (993 A.H.). The manuscript is from the Bašagić Collection of Islamic Manuscripts in the University Library of Bratislava, Slovakia, which was inscribed on the UNESCO Memory of the World register in 1997, Safvet beg Bašagić (1870-1934) was a Bosnian scholar, poet, journalist, and museum director who assembled a collection of 284 manuscript volumes and 365 print volumes that reflect the development of Islamic civilization from its inception to the early 20th century. The manuscript is item 586 in Jozef Blaškovič, Arabské, turecké a perzské rukopisy Univerzitnej knižnice v Bratislave (Arab, Turkish, and Persian manuscripts in the University Library, Bratislava).

Title: The Song of the Nibelungs (Codex A)

Description

The Nibelungenlied (The Song of the Nibelungs) is the most famous heroic poem in M German. It tells the story of the dragon-slayer Siegfried from his childhood and his man Kriemhild to his murder by the evil Hagen and Kriemhild's subsequent revenge, culmin annihilation of the Burgundians or Nibelungs at the court of the Huns. Originally based oral tradition, the poem was written down about or shortly after the year 1200, probably Wolfger von Erla, Bishop of Passau from 1191 to 1204. Today it is known only in the vehave come down to the present in 37 manuscripts and fragments dating from the 13th centuries. In the 19th century, the Nibelungenlied had an enormous influence as a Gerepic poem, as reflected in numerous works of visual art and in Richard Wagner's music Codex A, which is preserved in the Bavarian State Library, was listed, together with two manuscripts used to establish the text (Codices B and C), on the UNESCO Memory of the register in 2009.

Title: The History of Bologna in Four Books Galeatius Marescottus



Title: Orestes 338-44

Description

This Greek text on papyrus, written around 200 BC in Hermopolis, Egypt, has s containing parts of verses 338-344 from the first chorus of Orestes. Composed Greek tragedian Euripides (circa 480 BC-406 BC), the play recounts the story of mother Clytaemnestra to avenge the death of his father, Agamemnon, and is p for this deed. In addition to a passage of a chorus song (stasimon), the fragmen instrumental symbols written above the lines of the lyrics. It is one of a relatively surviving Greek texts with musical notation. Although much remains unknown ancient Greeks, scholars have tried to reconstruct from such notation how the c been sung and played. The papyrus, which was recovered from mummy carto 19th century, belongs to the Papyrus Collection of the Austrian National Library assembled in the 19th century by Archduke Rainer. It later came into the possession of the Hofbibliotek in Vienna. The Atlas Blaeu-Van der Hem was inscribed on the UNESCO Memory of Register in 2003.






Besides the international attention for world documentary heritage, the national aspirations to study nation heritage, to promote its accessibility, identification and evaluation are also important in the implementat Memory of the World programme.

Since 2007 Latvian National Commission for UNESCO has cooperated purposefully with memory in (archives, libraries, museums) in order to establish the Latvian National Memory of the World Regist National Commission for UNESCO and Latvian National Committee for UNESCO Memory of the developed "General guidelines for the Latvian Memory of the World Register".

The aim of the Latvian National Memory of the World Register is to promote the protection, accessibility at the most important national documentary heritage in Latvia and worldwide. The task of Latvian National Megister is to draw Latvian societies' attention to the role of documentary heritage in the existence of memory, importance of documentary heritage preservation and usage of appropriate tools for presenting. There are lot of unique values in memory institutions and private collections of Latvian accessibility, familiarization and identification of these values will enrich Latvians knowledge about the documentary heritage.



Title: Carnival in Oruro (Bolivia)

Description

This photograph shows a carnival dancer in Oruro, Bolivia, in an elaborate costume mask and gloves. The carnival, which takes place every year, lasts ten days and fea popular arts in such forms as masks, textiles, and embroidery. The main event is the entrada, in which the dancers walk the four-kilometer processional route repeatedly without interruption. Chapter 6 – Main activities, promotion and impact of the Memory of the World Programme

In this subchapter promotion of MoW Programme and nominations inscribed upon its registers by institutions in UNESCO Member States is described. The lack of cooperation with World Digital Library is pointed out and at the end the general impact of the Programme at national level is introduced shortly

Cooperation with World Digital Library

"The WDL Content Selection Working Group initially developed broad guidelines for selection. In addition, WDL partners worked to include important and culturally significant content about every UNESCO member country. The content is in a variety of formats and languages, from different places and time periods. The WDL focuses on significant primary materials, including manuscripts, maps, rare books, recordings, films, prints, photographs, architectural drawings, and other types of primary sources. One of the WDL's content objectives will be to work closely with UNESCO's Memory of the World program to make publicly accessible digital versions of these collections."

- Nevertheless, usually UNESCO NatComs or National MoW Committees do not cooperate directly with World Digital Library and it is done by other national institutions, for instance, national libraries
- Jamaica WDL cooperation partner at national level is the National Library of Jamaica;
- Latvia WDL cooperation partner at national level is the National Library of Latvia ("the first publicly available information at the World Digital Library concerning the Latvian documentary heritage is available since 2012");
- Mexico the cooperation is at the starting phase ("Yes. We are beginning the cooperation."), cooperation partner is not specified.

E.1. Observation: Most of the UNESCO Member States have not established cooperation with the World Digital Library (WDL) for promoting awareness and accessibility of documents inscribed in the National MoW Register.

Reflection: For the sake of raising the public awareness about the inscriptions upon international, regional and national MoW Registers, the World Digital Library is very useful tool. Therefore, it is surprising that so few UNESCO Member States take an advantage of this project – only respondents from Latvia, Jamaica, Mexico report that there is some cooperation with WDL established as well as other seven UNESCO Member States have expressed their interest for cooperation with WDL. Actually the possibility to inscribe a documentary heritage in the World Digital Library could be very attractive benefit for the owners or custodians of the documentary heritage to consider the possibility to prepare nominations for any of the MoW Registers.

Certainly this cooperation between UNESCO and the World Digital Library has not been emphasized enough. UNESCO do not have a lot of resources which could help UNESCO Member States to implement the MoW Programme at the national level, therefore it would be advisable to advertise this benefit of the MoW Programme more actively.

Some possible reasons

- Broad priorities of WDL (Arabic Scientific Manuscripts and books, Chinese Rare Books and Manuscripts, Mesoamerican Codices, Sub-Saharan Africa, Former Soviet Republics/Eurasia etc.)
- Not clear focus between "best representation each member state" v. most important or/and interesting themes/topics
- Different levels of ICT capacity un digitalisation policies in member states

Diversity of parallel activities – digital libs, portals and aggregators

Recomendation to UNESCO HQ

To promote more actively the possibility to cooperate with WDL. One of the **WDL's** content objectives will be to work closely with UNESCO's Memory of the World program to make publicly accessible digital versions of these collections.

For UNESCO and WDL

To evaluate how WDL could be used in education system for learning about general events of the history of the world and processes as well as regional and national course of events. Further a special section in WDL called "WDL for schools" with user friendly interface for youth and teachers could be created.

Recomendation to NatComs

To take advantage and cooperate with WDL in order to promote research and to raise the recognition of the national documentary heritage in international level. Although, most probably UNESCO NatComs and National MoW Committees won't be the direct cooperation partners for the WDL, nevertheless UNESCO NatComs could explore this cooperation possibility provided by UNESCO and the Library of Congress more actively. UNESCO NatComs and/or National MoW Committees could strive to inform national memory institutions about this opportunity and to convince them to cooperate with WDL in order to provide necessary content about national documentary heritage treasures in the quality based and international data base.

Some practical recomendations

- Establishing of permanent network between NatCom, National MoW Committee, memory and academic institutions
- If it is necessary, identifying one leading (contact) institution for representation in WDL
- Providing presentations and training professionals on behalf of MoW and WDL
- Supporting inclusion in WDL items from National Registers
- Coordination activities in framework of national policy for digitalisation of documentary heritage
- My suggestion is to add to the scope of criteria for evaluation of proposal for inscription in global, regional and national registers paragraph about readiness to cooperate with WDL
