### **Political system**

- The country is a Parliamentary Republic. Cabinet of Ministers appointed by the President, responsible to the National Assembly
- President David GRANGER (since 16 May 2015); Vice-Presidents Sydney ALLICOCK, Carl Barrington GREENIDGE, Moses Veerasammy NAGAMOOTOO, and Hemraj RAMJATTAN (since 20 May 2015); Prime Minister Moses Veerasammy NAGAMOOTOO (since 20 May 2015); note - the President is both Chief of State and Head of Government
- Elections: the predesignated candidate of the winning party in the last National Assembly election becomes President for a 5-year term (no term limits); election last held on 11 May 2015 (next to be held no later than 2020); Prime Minister appointed by the President.
