









Biennale of Luanda

Organized jointly by **UNESCO**, the **African Union** and the **Government of Angola**, the Biennale of Luanda aims to strengthen **the Pan-African Movement for a Culture of Peace** and **Non-Violence**.

The Biennale represents:

- ❖ A **privileged moment** that brings together actors and partners involved in the prevention of violence and conflicts, peacebuilding and gives voice to African women and youth
- ❖ A **platform** that promotes cultural diversity and African unity with the participation of the diasporas worldwide
- ❖ A multi-stakeholder partnership between governments, civil society, the artistic and scientific community, the private sector and international organizations





2019 Biennale key figures



Opening Ceremony: 3 heads of state, 12 national delegations, more than 900 participants.

Partners Forum and Thematic Forums: 116 panelists, 600 participants per day, 62 participating countries (including 45 African).

Festival of Cultures: 15,000 participants, 200 artists and a final concert gathering more than 7,000 people, 16 national pavilions (including 10 African).

The Biennale of Luanda 2021


The second edition of the Biennale will take place from **October 4 to 8, 2021** in Luanda, Angola, in a hybrid format, which will allow the virtual participation of the largest number of countries and partners.

Aligned with the African Union's 2021 theme "Arts, Culture & Heritage: Levers for Building the Africa We Want" and the "Silencing the Guns 2030" initiative.

The five-day program will be organized around the following axes:

- **❖** Intergenerational dialogue of leaders and youth
- Thematic and best practice forums
- Alliance of Partners for a Culture of Peace in Africa
- **❖** Festival of Cultures

- Contribute to the implementation, monitoring and evaluation of the projects in the 4 themes for the 2023 edition of the Biennale
