16:15–17:45 	<p>Plenary session I: Learning for health: A new paradigm for the post-COVID-19 era</p> <p><i>Learning for health is a personal and societal resource that enables people to protect and promote their individual health and that of their family (i.e. health literacy) as well as providing the knowledge, skills and capabilities necessary for actively participating in decisions about health and contributing to building healthy environments locally and globally (i.e. citizenship for health). At the city level, various learning opportunities take place within a ‘health learning pathway’ integrating the two dimensions of health literacy and citizenship for health throughout the life cycle. It addresses the actions of a wide range of stakeholders in a time of great need and profound challenges. In terms of community resilience, it explores examples of adaptable local populations, multi-sectoral planning for emergencies and crises, as well as bottom-up and top-down policies and practices to foster long-term resilience in a rapidly changing world. Regarding local learning systems, it pays attention to the roles of local governments, institutions and networks of stakeholders in ensuring the continuation of learning in cities during the pandemic, as well as ways of protecting learning systems in the face of future disruption, with a specific focus on the importance of innovation and technology.</i></p>

3. Technology-enhanced learning for healthy populations
