Resilient cities are better prepared to survive, adapt and grow, no matter what kinds of chronic stresses and acute shocks they experience



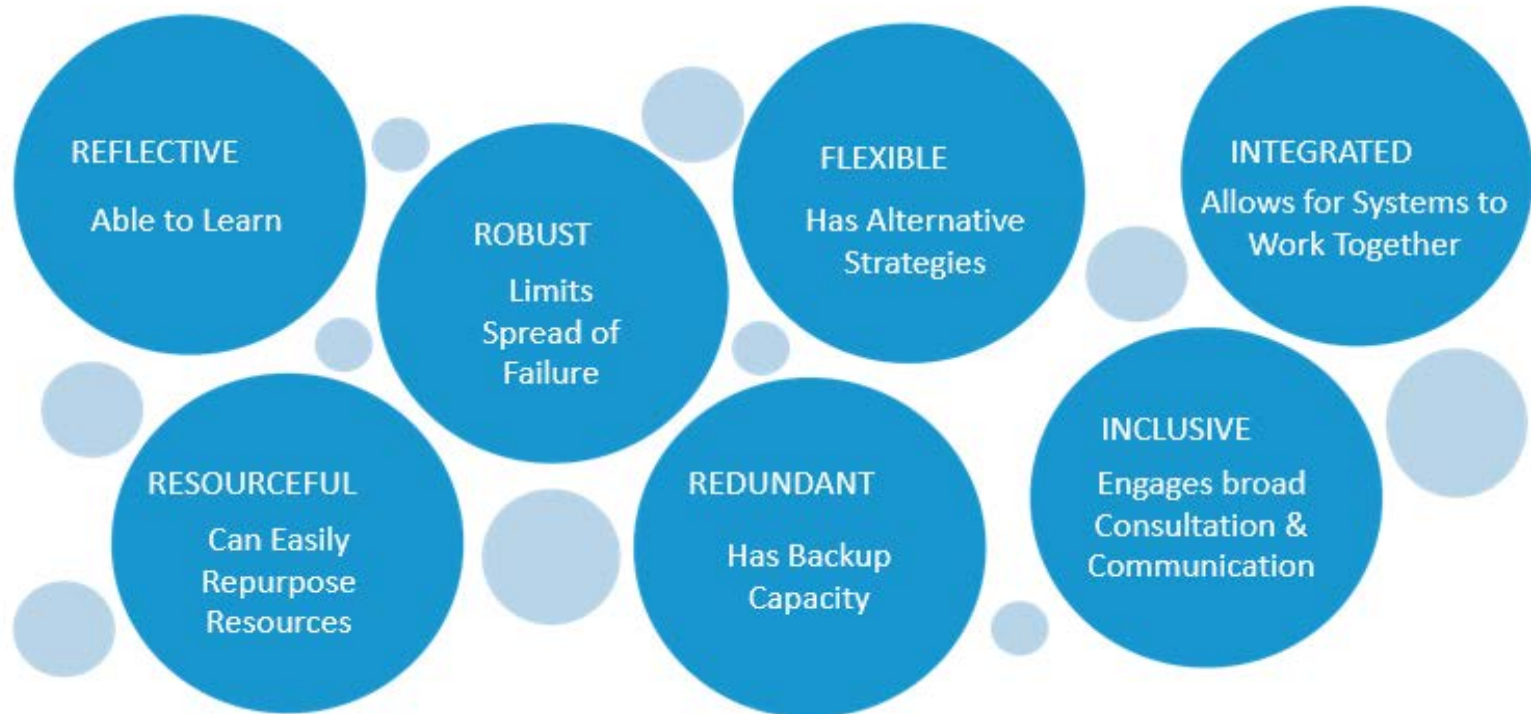
Adopting a Resilience lens helps to design better business models, capable of addressing multiple challenges at one time



How do we know if we are building resilience?

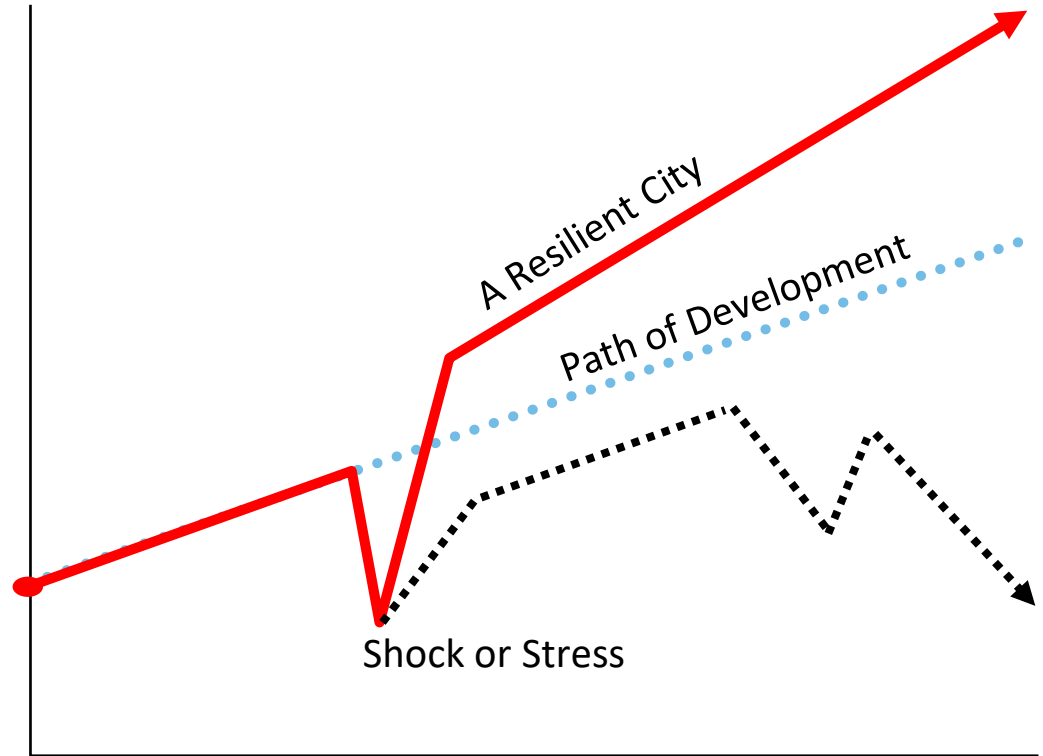
Qualities of Resilience

Resilient systems exhibit certain qualities that enable them to withstand, respond, and adapt more readily to shocks and stresses.



Building a resilient city

Rather than simply returning to a pre-existing state, a resilience approach can mean **changing to a new state** that is more effective in the altered environment (Maguire and Cartwright, 2008).



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Role of the Chief Resilience Officer (CROs)



- Bringing together diverse stakeholders to address shared challenges
- Designing innovative resilient projects and programs
- Informing decision making and advising city leaders on future risks and trends
- Leveraging opportunities for funding for the city
- Implementing resilient projects and programs
- Liaising with local communities and communicating with the public

COVID-19 what have we learned?

Resilience and the frameworks within which CROs operate have increased visibility.

- ✓ Covid has led to a heightened awareness around the importance of resilience that goes beyond crisis management
- ✓ framing the topic of resilience in relation to news stress and new changing conditions for the city

It was the investment into reflective learning during the drought crisis that put Cape Town's leadership in a position to act swiftly once they identified their biggest COVID-19 needs.

- Had the confidence to respond quickly and decisively to a public health crisis

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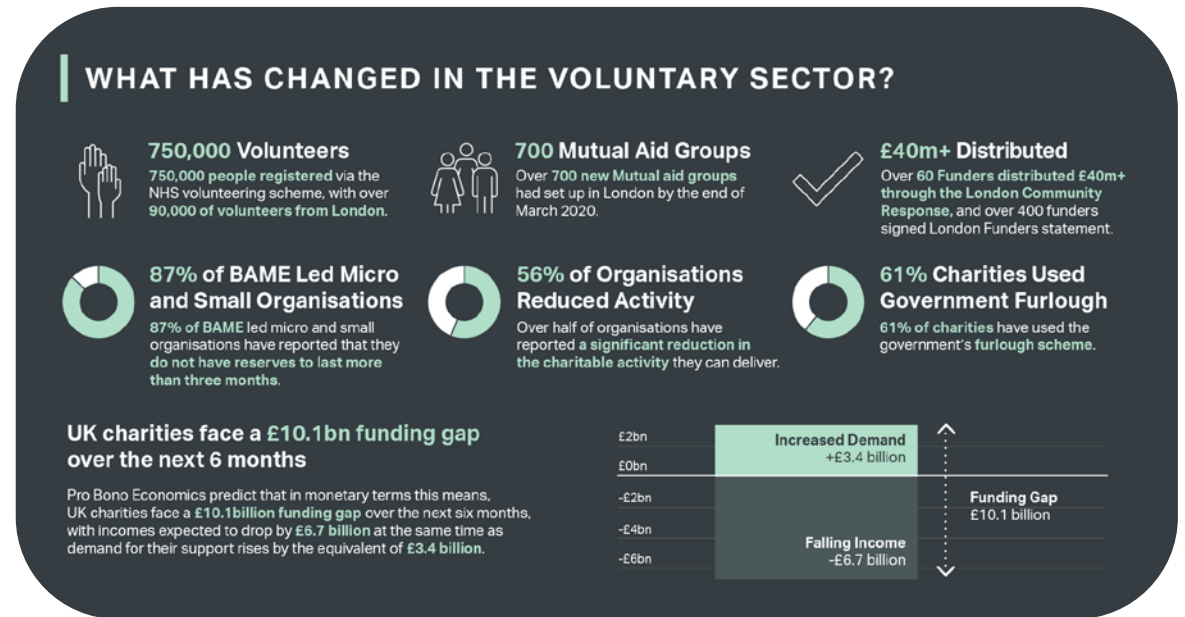
Case studies: London
