2. COUNTRY UPDATES (28 OCT – 3RD NOVEMBER)

Indonesia

<u>Situation Overview</u>: Through a joint decree from relevant ministries, the government has announced revised regulations for face-to-face learning in the schools for the next semester (2020/2021 school year). The decree will allow local governments to make decisions about conducting physical classes, depending on the readiness of each region.

OCHA and UNDP had initial technical discussions week beginning 16 November with the Coordinating Ministry for Human Development and the National Planning Agency regarding the provision of potential support for the monitoring of the COVID-19 response.

Local authorities in Aceh province have barred access to a vocational school compound where 381 Rohingya people, including 145 children, have been sheltering, following the death of an individual on the compound from COVID-19. All non-essential activities in the camp are now suspended.

Iran

<u>Situation Overview:</u> A new shipment of medical equipment procured under the Iran COVID-19 Emergency Response Project (ICERP), which is includes 56 portable echosonography devices, is being prepared for distribution to 56 hospitals in the country. ICERP is a new partnership platform between the WHO and the Ministry of Health and will make substantive contributions to the procurement and delivery of essential medical and diagnostic equipment to public hospitals and laboratories across the country caring for COVID-19 patients.

The Germen government has made a supplementary contribution of US\$1.2million to WFP-Iran to assist people affected by COVID-19 pandemic as well as by natural disasters such as floods, earthquakes, locust infestation.

<u>Media</u>: It took approximately 75 days for the first 100,000 cases to be reported in Iran, but just eight days for the number of cases to rise from 700,000 to 800,000.

Maldives

<u>Situation Overview:</u> On 22 November, Ministry of Education announced the resumption of preschool classes outside of the Greater Male' Region, after being put on hold since for eight months.

Authorities has begun conducting random sampling tests to determine the level of community spread within the Greater Male region. However, number of people voluntarily approaching the Flu testing centers to carry out the tests continues to decline.

Myanmar

<u>Situation Overview</u>: The State Counsellor revealed plans to relax restrictions in order to resume businesses activities, at the same that an increase in COVID-19 transmission was reported after the elections in the country.

Mandalay health authorities have authorized the use of home quarantine measures for people who have been in contact with those testing positive for COVID-19 due to a shortage of volunteers at state assigned quarantine centres.

Singapore

<u>Media</u>: With the resurgence of Covid-19 cases in Japan and Malaysia, Singapore is tightening its border controls for travelers who are arriving from those two countries, making it mandatory for them to undergo 14 days quarantine at dedicated facilities.
