

### 6- Description of the element

Khidr Elias Feast and its Vows is considered to be one of the most traditional festivals in Iraq. It is associated with the holy man (Alkhidr) whose personality is well-known among public people when he was mentioned in Al-Kahaf Sura Verse (65 - 82) of the Holy Qura'n in the story of accompanying Prophet Moses (PBUH) by

doing miracles and supernatural acts which Prophet Moses was unable to understand.

According to the ancient Iraqi beliefs, Alkhidr character has been associated with greenery and water, because wherever he was praying, the heaven began raining and the earth turned to be green. Moreover, people believe that he is still alive, wandering the lands over his horse and crossing the rivers. Iraqis also consider him as almighty person who achieves hopes and saves those in need for help. Therefore, there are many practices, various ceremonies and lot of cultural rituals held within each Iraqi community to glorify his personality.

As for the north of Iraq, particularly in Tal Afar district, which is inhabited by the majorities of Turkmen and Azzidis, families there celebrate Khidr Elias Feast on the last Thursday, Friday and Saturday of February each year, preceding it three days of fasting named (Baotha Fasting).

During the Eids' days, the common people, gather either on or near a particular hill where there is Alkhidr popular sanctuary on which they believe that he was passed by and sat there for a rest. Men, women and children wear traditional clothes and perform the popularTurkman dance named (Dabkka) while the musicians play on different musical instruments such as; bow, harb, violin, organ & timpani and singing folk songs. Among other celebrations are horse-races and jumping rope game.

In addition, throughout the feasts' days, the housewives and grandmothers prepare sacred food named (Dharakhose) cooked from fried cereal with meat and the most popular sweets known as

(Alkhidr Sweets) made of sugar, sesame and adorned with pistachio or walnut.

On the other hand, the farmers are keen on planting wheat and barley on the third day of the feast, believing that blessing would be extended on their agriculture and they will get good grains in the next harvesting season, due to their inherited beliefs that Khidr Elias personality is a symbol of fertility.

In the centeral area of Iraq, particularly Baghdad, the most prevalent ritual practice is called (Alkhidr vows). Through it, Baghdadi men and women from all Iraqi sects and religions, (Arabs, Kurds, Turkmen, Assyrians, Muslims, Christians, Azzidis and Mandaeans) and even the children, practice their rituals on each Thursday & Friday of Summer by preparing a tray full of sugar, salt, henna, sweets, candles and leaves of myrtle, bringing it to his famous sanctuary on the bank of Tigris under Bab AlMuadham Bridge, lighting candles inside his sanctuary and praying for this holy man to achieve their special wishes. At night, vowers send light candles on a piece of wood or cork in the river while making their demanding vows, just to ask for marriage if they are singles or to have a child if they have troubles in pregnancy, some others for solving certain problems especially the old women. Hence, if the candles go out before they reach the other bank, vowers will achieve their wishes so soon, but if they stay lightening, wishes need some time to achieve.

As for the Middle Euphrates provinces, in the south of Iraq, particularly Alkhidr district, men and women practice their vows by putting leaves of myrtle and only one light candle on a piece of wood,

then sending it in Euphrates, if the candle turn off before reaching the other bank, vowers must feed some poor people on any Friday hoping to achieve their wishes.

#### 7. Modes of transmission

The rituals of Khidr Elias Feast and its Vows involve variety of ceremonies, culinary skills, craftsmanship, traditional songs and dances, games and sports activities, skills and knowledge related to the nature and universe. These activities have been transmitted from old generation to young generation by traditional ceremonies that Iraqis practice today during the occasion, the legends and traditional stories, official and media's channels, schools' curriculums and scientific research works.
