



**Zeinab** est née au Soudan - sa famille a déménagé à Londres quand elle avait deux ans. Elle a étudié la philosophie, la politique et l'économie à l'Université d'Oxford et a obtenu une maîtrise (avec distinction) en histoire et anthropologie à la SOAS London University. Zeinab a reçu deux doctorats honorifiques : de la SOAS, London University et du London College of Communications - University of the Arts London pour ses services à la radiodiffusion.

Elle possède une vaste expérience de la télévision et de la radio et est surtout connue pour son travail à la BBC dans le cadre de l'émission "*Hard Talk*", qui met en vedette certaines des personnalités et des politiciens les plus connus au monde, "*Global Questions*" et "*World Debates*" à la télévision et à la radio BBC World. Par l'intermédiaire de sa propre société de production, elle a produit et présenté de nombreux programmes, dont actuellement la série télévisée de référence sur l'histoire de l'Afrique en association avec l'UNESCO.

En 2018, elle a reçu la Médaille du président de la British Academy pour ses services de radiodiffusion, le prix May Chidiac Lifetime Achievement Award, le MVISA Movie and Video Industry Lifetime Achievement Award et elle a été nommée à plusieurs reprises dans Power List comme l'un des 100 membres britanniques les plus influents de la communauté noire. En 2018, elle figurait parmi les 50 membres les plus influents de la diaspora africaine, selon le magazine African Leaders Magazine.

Zeinab est actuellement présidente de la Royal African Society, membre du conseil d'administration des Historic Royal Palaces, administratrice de BBC Media Action (la branche caritative de la BBC) et administratrice du Hampstead Theatre. Elle a été membre du conseil d'administration de la National Portrait Gallery, du British Council, du Centre for Contemporary British History, de l'Overseas Development Institute, de la Fondation de l'Union africaine, du Global Agenda Council for Africa du Forum économique mondial et présidente de l'organisation Article 19, basée à Londres, de la campagne pour la liberté de parole.

**Zeinab** was born in the Sudan - her family moved to London when she was two years old. She studied Philosophy, Politics and Economics at Oxford University and took a Masters Degree (awarded with a distinction) on History and Anthropology at SOAS London University. Zeinab has been awarded two honorary doctorates: from SOAS, London University and from the London College of Communications - University of the Arts London for her services to broadcasting.

She has extensive experience in television and radio, and is best known for her work on the BBC's 'Hard Talk', which features some of the best known personalities and politicians in the world, 'Global Questions' and World Debates featured on both BBC World TV and radio. Through her own production company she has produced and presented many programmes, including currently the definitive tv series of Africa's history in association with UNESCO.

Zeinab's awards include International TV Personality of the Year (the Association of International Broadcasters), in 2018 she was awarded the President's Medal by the British Academy for her services to broadcasting, the May Chidiac Lifetime achievement award, the MVISA Movie and Video Industry Lifetime Achievement Award and she has been named several times in 'Power List' as one of Britain's top 100 most influential members of the black community. In 2018 she was one of the top 50 most influential African diaspora members according to African Leaders Magazine.

Zeinab is the current Chair of the Royal African Society, a Queen's appointment to the Board of the Historic Royal Palaces, a trustee of BBC Media Action (the charitable arm of the BBC), and a trustee of Hampstead Theatre. She is a former board member of the National Portrait Gallery, the British Council, the Centre for Contemporary British History, the Overseas Development Institute, the African Union Foundation, the World Economic Forum's Global Agenda Council for Africa and is a former Chair of 'Article 19' the London based freedom of speech campaign organisation.

**Zeinab** nasceu no Sudão - sua família se mudou para Londres quando ela tinha dois anos de idade. Estudou Filosofia, Política e Economia na Universidade de Oxford e fez um mestrado (com distinção) em História e Antropologia na SOAS London University. Zeinab recebeu dois doutoramentos honoríficos: da SOAS, Universidade de Londres e do London College of Communications - University of the Arts London pelos seus serviços de radiodifusão.

Tem uma vasta experiência em televisão e rádio e é mais conhecida pelo seu trabalho no Hard Talk da BBC, que apresenta algumas das personalidades e políticos mais conhecidos do mundo, "Global Questions" e World Debates apresentados tanto na BBC World TV como na rádio. Através da sua própria produtora, ela produziu e apresentou muitos programas, incluindo actualmente a série televisiva definitiva da história de África em associação com a UNESCO.

Os prémios de Zeinab incluem International TV Personality of the Year (a Association of International Broadcasters), em 2018 foi-lhe atribuída a Medalha do Presidente pela Academia Britânica pelos seus serviços de radiodifusão, o prémio May Chidiac Lifetime, o MVISA Movie and Video Industry Lifetime Achievement Award e foi várias vezes nomeada em 'Power List'

como um dos 100 membros mais influentes da comunidade negra britânica. Em 2018, ela foi um dos 50 membros mais influentes da diáspora africana, segundo a revista African Leaders Magazine.

Zeinab é a actual Presidente da Royal African Society, uma das nomeações da Rainha para o Conselho de Administração dos Palácios Históricos Reais, uma administradora da BBC Media Action (o braço caritativo da BBC) e uma administradora do Hampstead Theatre. Foi membro do Conselho de Administração da National Portrait Gallery, do British Council, do Centre for Contemporary British History, do Overseas Development Institute, da African Union Foundation, do Global Agenda Council for Africa do World Economic Forum e é ex-Presidente do "Artigo 19" da organização da campanha de liberdade de expressão baseada em Londres.
