





2020 **Drafting process**

In 2016, the 22 IHP Intergovernmental Council Resolution IX called upon the IHP Secretariat to establish an intergovernmental Working Group for MAWAC in order to develop the framework for cooperation.

UNESCO has received 20 official nominations from 11 megacities (Paris, Mexico City, Lagos, Istanbul, Jakarta, Lima, Karachi, Lahore, Ho Chi Minh City, Bangkok, Bogota).

The 1st Draft of MAWAC-SGF is the collective effort undertaking an eight-month drafting process between the MAWAC Working Group and the Secretariat (UNESCO Headquarters and 8 Field Offices).

Official consultation and validation process

MAWAC officially invites the key stakeholders in megacities to take consultation on the draft MAWAC-SGF until 30th June 2021. Mayors or Governors will validate the revised MAWAC-SGF.

Signature and formal establishment

The MAWAC-SGF will be signed by the Mayors or Governors of the megacities, marking the official establishment of MAWAC, at the 2nd International Conference "Water, Megacities and Global Change".

Development of the specific action plans

The MAWAC Secretariat calls upon the Operational Board to develop the specific action plans within the MAWAC-SGF framework.

Vision




Element of Participation

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Supporting Mechanism

Membership

Eligibility Member is the current and emerging Megacities and / or their Metropolitan, Provincial, National entities.

Representation

Governor or Mayor, Deputy Mayor; Megacity official(s), including the head of the metropolitan entity, or Designated expert(s), formally endorsed by Mayor Office, Municipality or equivalent administrative entities.

Application and duration

Four-year term. Application opens for all year around.

Communication

Communication is vital for enabling effective participation, improving access to information, and in order to support the decision-making process and influence policy change of megacities.

Means

- Traditional and social media;
- events and conferences;
- Official websites of UNESCO;
- Water Information Network System (WINS);
- Communication and information materials;

* Each megacity should assign focal point(s) for communication activities and communicate it to UNESCO.

Language

- English is the main communication language.
- Other UN official languages (French, Spanish, Chinese, Russian and Arabic) will also be available based on the needs of the programmes.

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TIMELINE IN 2021-2022 FOR MAWAC-SGF CONSULTATION PROCESS

February

- July 2021 Review the 1st Draft of MAWAC-SGF, and submit the feedback to MAWAC Secretariat at UNESCO

UNESCO invites the Municipal Government (or equivalent*) of Megacities to review the full document of the 1st Draft of MAWAC Strategic Global Framework.

MAWAC Regional Meetings

Development of Terms of References (ToRs) for the corresponding MAWAC Regional Chapters by the designated officials and representatives.

Identify 4 Representatives of Megacities

In parallel to the review process, the Municipal Government (or equivalent) of the Megacity will identify and propose 4 representatives to UNESCO. To do so, the Megacity will need to complete "Part 1" of the "MAWAC Form", one of the attached documents in MAWAC-SGF folder.

July

- September 2021 Modify and refine the MAWAC-SGF

UNESCO coordinates with the Working Group to refine and finalize the 1st Draft, based on the consultation feedbacks received from the megacities.

October

- November 2021

Official validation of the MAWAC-SGF

UNESCO sends the final version of MAWAC-SGF to the Municipal Government (or equivalent*) of the Megacities for confirmation, and invites the Mayors/Governors to sign on MAWAC-SGF. To do so, the Megacity will need to complete "Part 2" of the "MAWAC Form", one of the attached documents in MAWAC-SGF folder.

11-14 January 2022

Official establishment of Megacities Alliance for Water and Climate (MAWAC) and cooperation platform
