### I. COUNTRY PROFILE

#### Political system

- The country is a Presidential Republic. The President is both Head of State and Head of Government. The Cabinet is appointed by the President.
- President: H.E. Mr. Guillermo LASSO (since 24 May 2021). The President is elected by absolute majority popular vote in two rounds if needed for a 4-year term (eligible for a second term).
- Minister of Foreign Affairs and Human Mobility: H.E. Mr. Mauricio MONTALVO.
