MOOC training "Engaging the European art market in the Fight against Illicit Trafficking in Cultural Property" Available from 1 to 31 March 2019

This dynamic, digital and interactive course was established with the support of the European Union. It is aimed at a wide European audience including representatives of the European art market, institutional representatives of the Member States of the European Union, academics in law, culture and art, and the general public.

The objective of the MOOC is to raise awareness regarding the existing legal frameworks to fight the illicit trafficking of cultural property, including the concept of due diligence.

Several European experts in the fight against illicit trafficking in cultural property, and representatives of institutions such as the International Institute for the Unification of Private Law (UNIDROIT), EUROPOL and the European Commission among others, participated in the development of the training content through filmed interviews, accessible in the MOOC.
