National Contact Points

- **Collaboration with the Network of National Contact Points (NCPs) in Member States:**
 - **As the NCPs are national structures, the type and level of services offered may differ from country to country but in general, distribution of documentation (forms, guidelines, manuals etc.) is provided as the basic service**

National research funders

Welcome to PIREDEU

Welcome to the website of the Collaborative Project on "Providing an Infrastructure for Research on Electoral Democracy in the European Union", co-ordinated by the European University Institute and its Robert Schuman Centre for Advanced Studies. PIREDEU has its origins in the European Election Studies (EES) conducted under various auspices since 1979.

The pan-European project is funded by the European Union under the Seventh Framework Programme from 2008 up to 2011. This three-year design study will assess the feasibility of an upgrade to the European Election Studies that will provide an infrastructure for research into citizenship, political participation, and electoral democracy in the European Union (EU). The scientific and technical feasibility of this infrastructure will be investigated by means of a pilot study conducted in the context of the 2009 elections to the European parliament. If the pilot study is successful the EES will be in a position to request funds to create a comprehensive empirical database that would endow the social science community with the most essential information required for a recurrent audit of the most important aspects of the electoral process in the European Union.

- **BG: national repository infrastructure launched** (<http://node3.d.dnet.research-infrastructures.eu:8680/ui/bulgaria/index.do>)
- **SK: the first national shared repository is launched in partnership with CERN**
- **RO: re-launched a national open access portal** <http://www.acces-deschis.ro/> and plans to release a National project information database (research projects, their results and people involved)



Successes (2)

- **PL: the Chancellery of the Prime Minister and the Ministry of Science and Higher Education are working on a legislation to make the results of publicly funded research open access:**
 - deposited in open access repositories and/or published in open access journals
- **SI: The Ministry of Higher Education, Science and Technology presented the Research Infrastructure Development Plan 2011-2020.**
 - Chapter 3.4.7 of the Plan anticipates the establishment of a national open data and open publication infrastructure and mandatory deposition of publicly funded data and publications
