#### Background

The High-level Meeting on February 26 2013 entitled, 'Using e-Science to Strengthen the Interface between Science, Policy and Society' will look at the role of e-Science in supporting decision making in the science, policy and society interface with the aim of improving knowledge exchange between scientists and civil society, including rural communities and indigenous peoples. It will also explore the feasibility of creating a web-based platform to; inform policy decisions, facilitate dialogue and share information and data to promote the continued interface between science, policy and society.

The High-level Meeting will consist of two main sessions a Technical Working Group (TWG) meeting, and a High-level Roundtable. The TWG Meeting will explore practices and emerging trends in e-Science with particular focus on youth-led initiatives in LDCs. It will also provide the opportunity to brainstorm the role of a web-based information sharing platform in supporting decision making, and strengthening the involvement of communities and citizens in the science, policy, society interface. The High-level Roundtable will explore the opportunities and challenges of using e-science to support decision making in science policy. This discussion will also look at the technical requirements for designing the web-based platform and provide an opportunity to share best practices and lessons learnt from similar platforms.

The main outcomes of the session include:

- i) recommendations from key specialists on issues concerning the design of a web-based platform to improve the interface between science, policy and society;
- ii) the creation of an action plan for the establishment of the platform;
- iii) the mobilization of various partners to support the design and establishment of the platform;



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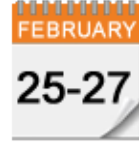
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- iv) the exploration of new and emerging trends in e-science to inform the design process of the platform.

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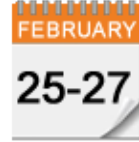
