
Item 5.1 - UNESCO at the 9th World Water Forum

UNESCO coordinated and/or participated in **33 events**, of which the main celebration of the **World Water Day** and the **high-level panel on Groundwater** on 22 March, 12 ordinary thematic sessions and special sessions, and 19 sessions at the UNESCO Water Family Pavilion. The sessions attracted an estimated cumulated **in-situ audience of over 2500 persons**, approximately 40% women and 60% men.

In the presence of heads of States from Africa, UNESCO's Director-General launched the **UN WWDR2022 'Groundwater: making the invisible visible' on 21 March 2022** at the Opening Ceremony of the 9th World Water Forum (WWF9) by handing over a copy of the Report to the President of Senegal on behalf of UN-Water. The report was presented in more depth during the **World Water Day (WWD) pivotal event** the next day.

The Report launch and the topic of "groundwater" received extensive **media** coverage.

The World Water Development Report is available in English, French and Italian with Spanish and Chinese **translations** available later this year. The Executive Summary is available in 11 languages.



Item 5.1 - Celebration of the UN World Water Day 2022 "Groundwater: making the Invisible Visible"

The celebration of the **World Water Day**, organized on the 22nd March by UNESCO and IGRAC on behalf of UN-Water, included three events:

- A **Plenary session** which witnessed a "**Pass the groundwater baton ceremony**" from the World Water Day Task Force to the World Water Council, aimed at **sustaining attention to groundwater in future editions of the World Water Forum**. It was also the occasion for UNESCO to launch the **Groundwater Youth Network**.
- A High-Level Panel on Groundwater that examined how groundwater offers a potential pathway to sustain human activities and ecosystems health, with a particular focus on Africa and SIDS.
- A special session that introduced the Groundwater Catalogue, a tool compiling management and governance tools, measures and instruments that will assist policy makers in exploring and finding suitable solutions for complex groundwater issues.

Item 5.2 – UN-Water campaign on groundwater during the year 2022

UNESCO, together with its International Groundwater Resources Assessment Centre (IGRAC), led the **World Water Day 2022 campaign on "Groundwater: Making the invisible visible"** on behalf of UN-Water; the campaign will remain active throughout the year.

UNESCO will coordinate the organization of a **series of key events related to groundwater**, aimed at conveying a message about the importance of these hidden resources to the UN intergovernmental Water Conference taking place in March 2023.

UNESCO has organized as a pre-event the **Second International Conference on Transboundary Aquifers (ISARM2021)** at UNESCO HQs, 6-9 December 2021





Item 5.2 - Groundwater campaign/year 2022 including the Groundwater Summit

The **UN-Water Summit on Groundwater** will take place on 7th and 8th December 2022 at UNESCO HQs, Paris, and is tentatively planned as a hybrid meeting with the most possible on-site presence. The 6th December will be a **Pre-Summit** day, devoted to side-events only.

The Summit will use as baseline the World Water Development Report 2022 focused on Groundwater, and the SDG 6 Global Acceleration Framework as a guideline to define actions towards more responsible and sustainable use and protection of this vital natural resource.

Item 5.4 - Other high-level events: UNESCO IHP towards the UN 2023 Water Conference

- In 2018, the United Nations General Assembly decided to convene in New York, from 22 to 24 March 2023, the United Nations Conference the Midterm on Comprehensive Review of the Implementation of the Objectives of the International Decade for Action, 'Water for Sustainable Development' 2018-2028.
- The **UN 2023 Water Conference** will be co-hosted by the Kingdom of the Netherlands and Tajikistan.
- It will be preceded by regional and global preparatory meetings and informed by other water-related meetings (Roadmap).

Item 5.4 - Other high-level events: UNESCO IHP towards the UN 2023 Water Conference

- As a follow up of the UNESCO IHP Council Resolution XXIV-5, IHP is pursuing its involvement in the **preparatory process** of the UN 2023 Water Conference and participating/contributing to the **global and regional events** listed in the Roadmap.
- UN Regional Commissions have been invited to **provide regional inputs** to the UN Water Conference 2023 by the end of June 2022. These inputs aim to reflect the diversity of views and experiences from the regions, and not any agreed position from the region. They will inform the UN Secretary General's report on the mid-term review to be presented at the 77th session of the UN General Assembly and will inform the United Nations 2023 Water Conference:
 - ESCWA 18-19 May
 - ESCAP 20 April
 - ECE 12-13 April
 - ECLAC 28 April
 - ECA date tbc in May (in consultation with AMCOW)

Item 5.4 - Dushanbe Water Decade Process Conference

Panel "Transboundary water cooperation for economic growth and sustainability" (7 June 2022)















Goal of the session: to identify concrete actions to promote cooperation on shared waters in support of national efforts to reach the SDG targets by 2030.

Through discussion with selected panelists, the session will:

- review current state of cooperation on shared waters
- identify barriers and tools to strengthen cooperation, as well as steps that national governments can take
- showcase examples of effective transboundary water cooperation from Central Asia and beyond.

Expected main messages of the session:

- Sound integrated management of transboundary waters is critical to achieving food, energy, and water security.
- Action must be accelerated to meet SDG target 6.5 by 2030
- There are solutions available for promoting the cooperative management of shared water resources
- To accelerate action, investments are needed in addressing data and information gaps, capacity development, infrastructure, legal and institutional strengthening and water diplomacy.

UN SDG 6 Global Acceleration Framework



- Formal Initiative of UN-Water established in March 2021, in the context of the SDG 6 Global Acceleration
 Framework launched by the UN Secretary General, which has capacity development as one of its pillars
 ("accelerators"):
- The CDI is coordinated by UNESCO through IHP together with UN DESA. The Concept Note for the CDI was approved by UN-Water in October 2021 and the Workplan was approved at the 36th UN-Water meeting 7-8 April 2022.
- CDI Membership: 35 (including UN-Water Members and Partners).
- Spain already supporting the CDI, as well as the IHE Delft Institute for Water Education. Dialogue with other potential donors to be held on 5 May 2022.






Objectives

- 1. To provide a coordinated entry point for countries requesting UN-Water's support to identify capacity gaps hindering the implementation of SDG 6.
- 2. To support the countries in undertaking a capacity gaps assessment based on inter-sectoral/inter-ministerial and multi-stakeholder approaches, and in preparing a national capacity development plan.
- 3. To facilitate access to capacity development offerings and experience of UN-Water Members and Partners, tailoring them as needed, and support follow-up of capacity development interventions.
- 4. To raise awareness of the indispensable role that water and sanitation play within sustainable development, in particular for the implementation of the 2030 Agenda and for the realization of all human rights, and of the importance to involve other key stakeholders in capacity development initiatives as appropriate (such as civil society, academia, TVET, the private sector, local government, technicians and operators, including those in the informal sector).
