2016 Activities report

1 – The IGCP project 653 started in 2016. This year thus served essentially to launch the programme, through different meetings (Durham in the U.K., Lille and Lyon in France), and through the opening of a webpage: www.igcp653.org.

Over 180 scientists have already joined this programme, led by Dr. Thomas Servais (Univ. Lille).

2 – Three new IGCP applications that involve French co-leaders were submitted for evaluation in 2016. These are entitled as follows:

- "Improved regional seismotectonic map in Africa: a key component for the seismic hazard and risk assessment (SEISMOSHAF)"
- "Reading geologic time in Paleozoic sedimentary rocks: the need for an integrated stratigraphy"
- "Toarcian Oceanic Anoxic Event: impact on marine carbon cycle and ecosystems"

A letter, endorsing and supporting the proposal, was provided by the SGF-IGCP.

3 – SGF participates in the "office report" evaluations for candidate Geoparks
