I. ASSISTING UNESCO MEMBER STATES IN THE FORMULATION OF NATIONAL INFORMATION POLICY FRAMEWORKS

1. Development of Information/Knowledge Policy and Strategy Templates.

Contractor: Fundación Gestión y Desarrollo, Argentina

Deliverables - The Information/Knowledge Policy and Strategy Templates that will consist of the following parts:

- 1. A methodology for developing an information policy;
- 2. A glossary;
- 3. A template of the information policy (a common core of chapters applied to all situations and, where needed, specific chapters more adapted to developed/developing countries), including:
 - a. a summary of its contents with a description of policy objectives to be achieved in each area of the information policy (e.g. providing connectivity to the population; ensuring the production of indigenous content; capacity building to ensure media and information literacy, development of an appropriate legal and regulatory framework, etc.), assuming a staged, gradual approach to the achievement of these objectives and specifying where this can be left to the private sector and where State and publicsector intervention is necessary;
 - b. a general description of criteria and benchmarks needed for assessing progress in the implementation of information policy and achievement of its objectives;
 - c. a methodology for updating the information policy, as required.
