#### Tanzanian project

The IFAP Bureau, at its 11<sup>th</sup> meeting, agreed to allocate up to US\$35,000 from the IFAP Special Fund for the project "Promoting preservation and sharing of health information through the establishment of health information systems" submitted by the National Institute for Medical Research (NIMR) in Tanzania and requested its proponents to include a regional component.

A revised proposal<sup>1</sup> was submitted to the Secretariat end of March, fund is being decentralized to Tanzania and the contract will be establish between UNESCO Office in Dar Es Salam and NIMR.
