HOW DID WE COLLECT INFORMATION?


41 respondents answered 17 questions addressing the effectiveness of Hub engagements, preferred areas of education research and interest in cluster groups for peer learning


PREFERRED THEMATIC FOCUS ARES FOR PEER LEARNING
