



Archives of the Dutch East India Company (Since 2003) - About twenty-five million pages of VOC (The Dutch East India Company -Verenigde Oostindische Compagnie) records have survived in repositories in Jakarta, Colombo, Chennai, Cape Town, and The Hague. 2. Gilgit Manuscript (Since 2017) -The birch bark and clay coated Gilgit manuscripts are the oldest surviving manuscripts in India. 3. laghukālacakratantrarājatikā (Vimalaprabhā) (Since 2011) - These manuscripts are significant in terms of their historical, intellectual and aesthetic value. The text contains detailed discussions of astrology and astronomy.
