

It is aimed at young people and civil society organisations of the cultural and creative industries in the 17 Member States of the Caribbean Community (CARICOM), the Caribbean Forum (CARIFORUM) and the Organisation of Eastern Caribbean States (OECO).

As part of the Programme, young people from Antigua and Barbuda, the Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Cuba, Dominica, the Dominican Republic, Grenada, Guyana, Haiti, Jamaica, Montserrat, Saint Kitts and Nevis, Saint Lucia, Saint Vincent and the Grenadines, Suriname, and Trinidad and Tobago play a leading role in integration and synergy initiatives aimed at reinforcing the contributions of the cultural and creative industries to the region's economic development and dynamism.

Transcultura has created a Regional Cultural Training Hub in Cuba where academic and cultural institutions from Cuba and the Caribbean converge to offer short face-to-face and online courses covering different areas of the cultural and creative industries.

With a gender and inclusion perspective, the Programme

provides scholarships to ensure that opportunities for access to the Regional Cultural Training Hub are equitable and reach the greatest variety of young people in the Caribbean.

> Likewise, Transcultura creates spaces for cultural exchanges and twinnings through new triangular cooperation mechanisms between Caribbean countries and between

Caribbean countries and Europe. These synergies will stimulate the involvement of innovative socio-cultural projects in the region's sustainable development.

To achieve its aims. Transcultura also coordinates the implementation of several Incubator/Accelerator activities to facilitate young people's access to new markets, management models and funding sources, both within the Caribbean and in Europe. Thanks to the impact of these activities, the capacities for entrepreneurship and innovation in the cultural and creative industries of the Caribbean states covered by the Programme will be strengthened.

In addition, *Transcultura* sponsors strategies to promote sustainable forms of cultural tourism enabling visitors to discover the heritage and artistic resources of the Caribbean. in harmony with the boundless natural riches of the region.
