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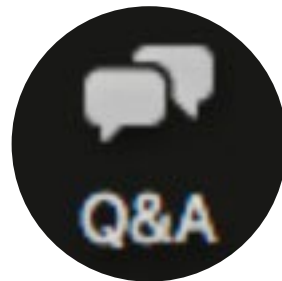

The United Nations observance of IWD 2023 highlights the role of digital fields in advancing women's empowerment and rights.





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Gender and Employment

- 46% workforce¹
- 77% less in earnings²
- 28% of managerial positions held³

Women in TVET

- Only 31 out of 133 countries achieved gender parity in TVET⁴
- 43% of students enrolled in vocational programmes at the upper secondary were female, compared to 49% in general education programmes⁵
- Women account for only 35% of STEM students in higher education globally⁶
- In Africa, participation rate of youth and adults in education and training is much lower than the cross-region average, for both men and women.⁷
