



#### A-positive-trend

Meanwhile, Ghana, Madagascar, Morocco and Togo are in the final phase of their internal procedure of accession to the Convention and UNIBROT is waiting for the deposit of their instruments of accession with the Italian-Government 1

#### Factors-¶

Since February 2017, we registered a positive trend and a renewed interest in the Convention (see chartabove). Compared to 2016, in the last two years the number of ratifications or accessions to the treaty-hasincreased exponentially. According to the Unenon Secretariat, the principal factors that have contributed toboosting ratifications and accessions are.

1) → United Nation-Security Council Resolution-2199-of February 2015.¶ 2) → United Nation-Security Council Resolution 2347-of March 2017.¶ 3) → Informal Ratification Task Force ¶ 4) → European-Union's initiatives ¶ 5) → G7 Culture (Fornce) = (March 30-31, 2017.¶

#### United Nation Security Council Resolution 2199-of February 2015

Resolution 2199 adopted by the United Nations Security Council on 127 Entrumy 2015 explicitly acknowledges that-illicit relificing is among the sources of financing of terrorism- and prohibits cross border trade in Iraqiand Syrian cultural property illegally removed from Iraq since 6 August 1990 and from Syria since 15 March 2011. It also asks for a safe return of such objects and the 1995 Unionori Convention is still today the only powerful legal toolfocasing on existitution. ### United Nation Security Council Resolution 2347 of March 2017

Resolution 2347-affirms the protection of cultural heritage as a key means for the maintenance of international peace and security. Resolution 2347 does not directly mention the 1995-Unuton-Convention to which one permanent member of the Security Councilis apartury (China) and another one is a signatory (France). However, the Resolution encourages all Member States "... to consider ratifying the Convention for the Protection of Cultural Property in the Event of Armed Conflict of 14 May 1954 and its Protocols, as well as other relevant international conventions". ¶

### G7-Culture-{Florence}-of-March-30-31,-2017¶

Unusion: was among the participants to the first G7 Culture meeting of the history of G7, held in Florence, under the tallan Presidency. #### European-Union's initiatives

Europe's reportedly the largest exporter of art and antiquities, and the second largest importer. On January 17, 2019, the EU Periometr passed the Resolution on cross-border restatution claims of works of art and cultural goods loaded in armate conflicts and way which recommend the EU Memore States to ratify the 1995. Early 2018, the Senate of Belgium recommended to examine the possibility to accede to the 1995 Unionor. Convention marking a change in market countries' position in respect to the matter.
